I am a Circuit City Sales associate. I recently purchased the 46z and am impressed with the settings that were given from this website. Right out of the box, the tv's motion enhancer is probably turned off. I set mine to standard. One question to ask is what kind of HDMI cable are you running? I have the monster 1000 series and it does wonders. Especially with gaming. I first purchased it for my xbox to use with my 50 inch Panasonic plasma and it made quite a difference over the 400 series monster HDMI. It allows 10gbps compared to 5 from the 400 cable. Right now I have the monster 500 series HDMI hooked to my cable box and 1000 to the Sony BDPS-350 bluray and xbox. With the blu ray the motion blur was fixed significantly. On the xbox i am still figuring out the best settings. If you haven't purchased the cable, definitely look into it. It can handle anything you throw at it. It is also backed by monster for life. So, if ever becomes obsolete, you can trade it in for the better one for free. i hope this cleared up a little for you. Like I was saying, so far I am impressed. Good luck with your tweaking.
